#### **Auditory Processing Activities**

- 1. **Musical Chairs**: This activity will improve auditory attention and memory because he/she must listen for the music stoppage and remember to sit in a chair.
- 2. **Story time:** Read a story to your child that contains a word that is repeated in the story. Use an object that matches the word and have the child complete a task every time he hears the selected word. (Raise a bear puppet when the word bear is used in He Bear, She Bear)

#### 3. Categorization:

- \* Have the child name items of a given category. (Name 3 things that you can ride)
- \* Have the child repeat, in order, a series of objects from familiar categories. (Say these fruits after me: apple, banana, pear.)
- \* Identifies the categories to which items belong. (What are these: chair, table, sofa? *Furniture*)
- 4. **Associations:** Have the child name a word that can be associated with a given word. (What goes with a spoon?)
- 5. **I Spy:** Provide the child with the clues and see if they can name the object being described. (I spy something that you drink out of.)
