### Tips to Help Your Child Process and Answer "WH" Questions

#### "Who" Questions

"Who" questions require a person or occupation answer.

- Look at the pictures in a book, magazine, or photo album. Ask about each person's attributes. For example, ask "Who has brown hair?" or "Who is eating?"
- Ask questions related to your child's school and class. Ask "Who sits beside you in class?" or "Who did you play with at recess?" These questions help your child assign meaning to "who" questions.
- Watch a television program or video with your child. During the show, ask "Who" questions about the different characters. For example, ask "Who is talking?" or "Who wants to play?"
- Ask "Who" questions about the community or a past experience. These more advanced questions help broaden your child's language processing skills. Ask "Who serves food in a restaurant?" or "Who do you see when you are sick?"

#### "What" Questions

"What" questions require either an object answer or an explanation.

- Ask your child to label objects in your home. Point to an object and ask him/her "What is this?" Advance this skill by describing an object in the room and asking your child to guess the answer. For example, ask "What do we call the long piece of furniture in the room that we sit on?"
- Ask your child the function of an object, such as "What do we do with an iron?" or "What are scissors used for?"
- Ask your child the definition of his/her spelling words.
  Ask "What does the word calendar mean?" after he/she practices spelling it. This is a great way to build language into other school subjects.

#### "When" Questions

"When" questions require a time answer.

- Ask simple questions that require a day or nighttime answer, such as "When does the sun shine?" or "When do you go to bed?"
- Once your child is able to answer simple "When" questions, ask more advanced questions that require morning, afternoon, or evening for answers. For example, ask "When do you eat breakfast?" or "When do you go to recess?"
- The next level of "when" questions requires answers related to a season of the year. Ask "When does it snow?" or "When do you go swimming?"

#### "Where" Questions

"Where" questions require a location answer.

- Ask your child the specific location of objects in your home. Walk around the house together and ask "Where is the microwave?" or "Where are your socks?"
- Take a trip to the zoo or fun park. Take turns asking each other "Where are the elephants?" or "Where is the tallest ride?"
- Ask more advanced "Where" questions related to the community or a past experience. For example, ask "Where do we buy groceries?" or "Where did we go for vacation last summer?"

#### "Why" Questions


"Why" questions require reasoning and thinking skills.

- The ability to process and answer "Why" questions is the most advanced answering skill. For beginners, give the student two answer choices with the question. For example, ask "Why does a dog drink water? Is it because he is thirsty or because he is tired?"
- Your child also becomes more familiar with answering "Why" questions by reading "joke books." Encourage your child to focus on how to answer "Why" questions, rather than giving a correct answer.

#### "WH" Question Combo Tic-Tac-Toe




#### "WH" Combo Question Cube


